SING TOGETHER

- Sing "Going on a Bear Hunt" by Michael Rosen, "The Bear Went Over the Mountain," and "The Wheels on the Bus" by Verna Hills!
- As you sing, ask children about interesting-sounding words or words that sound the same.
- Act out the songs, too! "The Wheels on the Bus" is great to act out!



MAKE A BEAR MASK


- To create these fun bear faces (and turn them into masks!), you will need: paper plates, crayons or markers, brown and black construction paper, Popsicle sticks, tape, scissors, and glue.
- *Adult prep: Cut the paper plates in half and then punch two holes for the eyes. Cut brown semicircles for the ears and a black circle for the nose.
 - Color the entire paper plate, using either crayons or markers.
 - Glue the ears on the top of the plate.
 - Glue the nose to the center of the plate.
 - Tape the Popsicle stick to the inside of the mask to use as a handle.
 - Decorate the mask with markers.



CREATE YOUR OWN BEAR EARS

- Create your bear-y own bear ears! Materials needed: brown construction paper, scissors, crayons or markers, and a stapler or tape.
 - Cut two semicircles out of the brown construction paper.
 These will be the bear ears.
 - Decorate the ears with crayons or markers.
 - Cut a strip of brown construction paper to fit around the child's head.
 - Staple or tape the strip of brown construction paper together to create a headband.
 - Staple or tape the bear ears to the front of the headband.
 - Wear! You look just like a bear!











HELP THE BEAR FIND YOUR HIS SANDWICH!








WHAT'S ON YOUR FAVORITE SANDWICH?
