Guessing Game!

"I meant what I said and I said what I meant."

Part of what makes Dr. Seuss's books so fun to read and laugh about together is the silly and inventive vocabulary. See if you can stump your listeners by reading a mix of Seuss words and real words together. After each word, have your listeners yell out their answer of "real" or "Seuss," and once everyone has weighed in, share the answer.

Storytime!

"The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go."

Have your guests settle in to listen to The Cat in The Hat, Green Eggs and Ham, Horton Hears a Who! or any other Dr. Seuss favorites! Depending on time and interest, feel free to just read excerpts of a few.

Red Light, Green Light!

"I do not like them here or there. I do not like them anywhere. I do not like green eggs and ham."

Line all participants up in an area with open space, facing towards you. When you say "green eggs" have participants move toward you, but when you say "ham" they must stop and freeze. Anyone who moves after you say "ham" must start over. The object of the game is to cross the finish line as quickly as possible.



Get Creative!

"There are so many THINKS that a thinker can think!"

Time to think like a real Dr. Seuss character! Have each participant look around the room for one object they can use for inspiration. Once they have their item in mind, have them come up with a new imaginative purpose it will serve, and an equally interesting new name.



Connect the Dots with Fox in Socks!


Start at #1 and connect the dots until the picture is complete!

With an adult's help, cut out and color the board and game pieces, then pair up with a partner for a fun-filled game of tic-tac-toe!








In for a Treat
