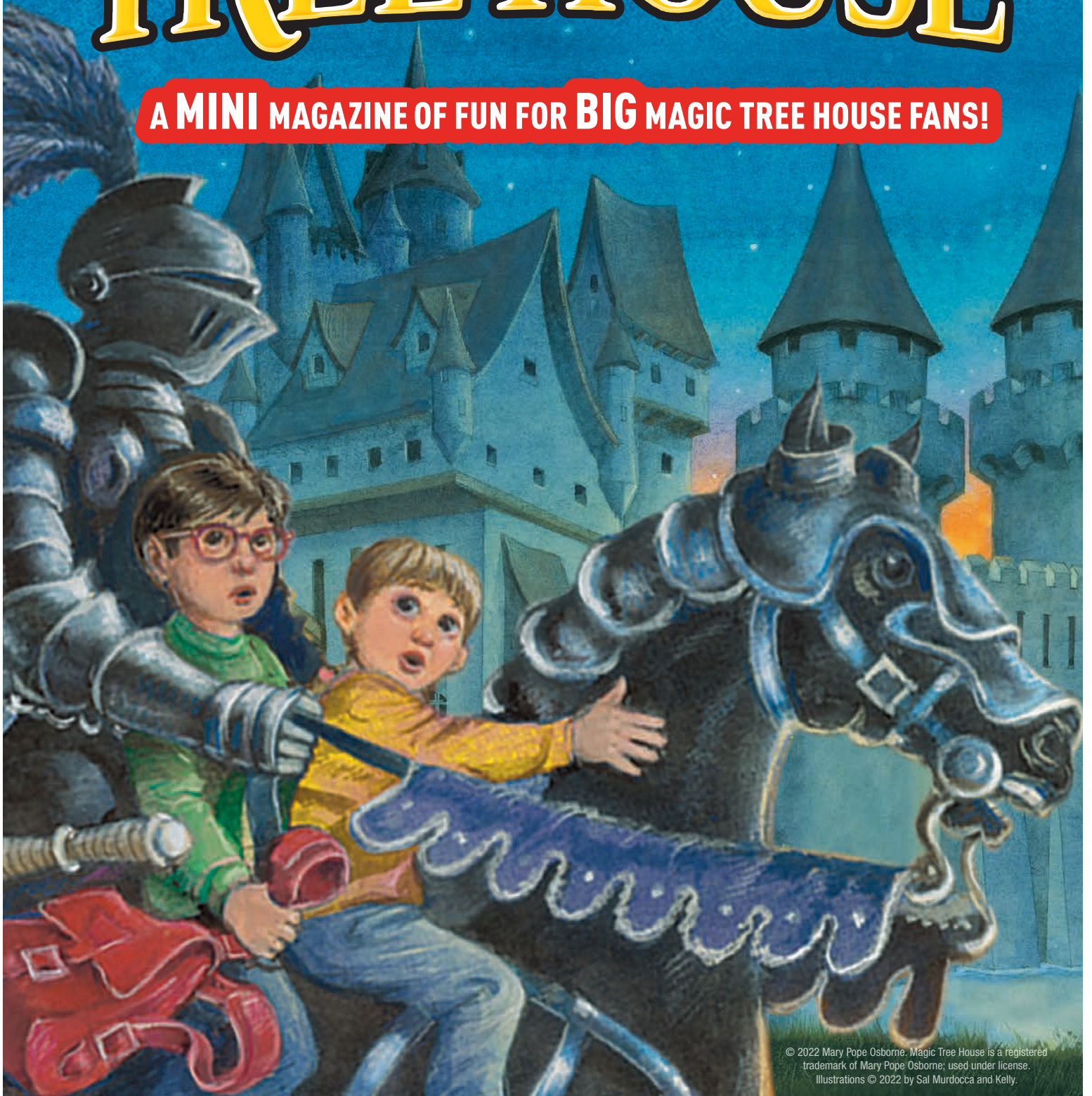

Natalie: I think my present-day heroes probably don't have fame or a lot of money. They are the people like doctors, nurses, and aid workers who risk their lives to help others.

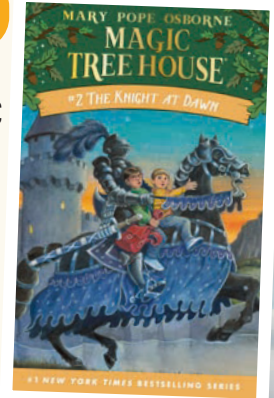
What have been some of Jack and Annie's favorite animal adventures?

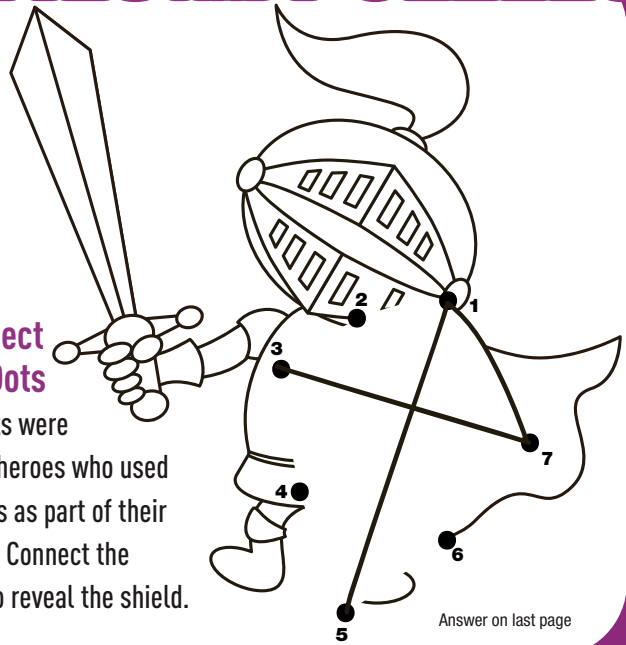

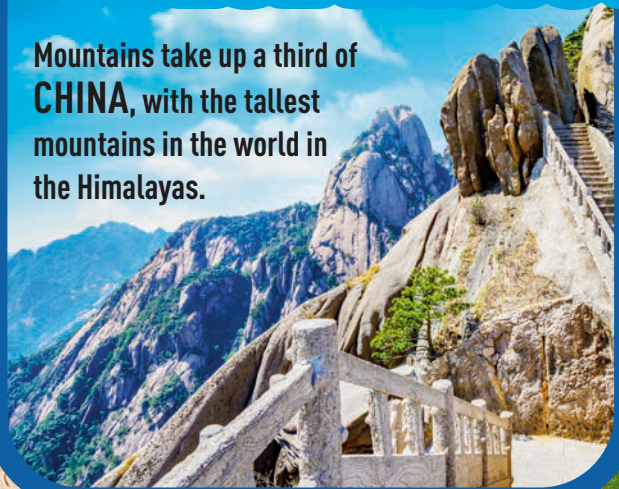

We recently caught up with **Mary Pope Osborne**, author of *Magic Tree House* and *Merlin Missions*, and **Natalie Pope Boyce**, author of the *Magic Tree House Fact Trackers*, and asked them a few questions!

Kids love learning and reading about dinosaurs! Do you have a favorite dinosaur?

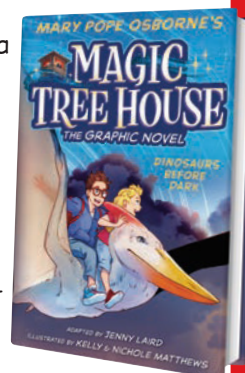

FACT TRACKER

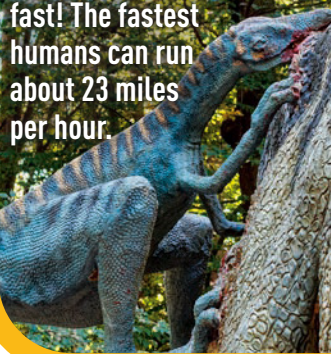
Marsh and Cope were two scientists who **STUDIED DINOSAUR FOSSILS**. They were so competitive that they even tried to steal from each other's collections of dinosaur bones!

The **DINOSAUR** with the longest **NAME** is the micropachycephalosaurus (MY-cro-PACK-ee-SEF-uh-lo-SOAR-us). It means "tiny" (micro) "thick" (pachy) "head" (cephalo) "lizard" (saurus).

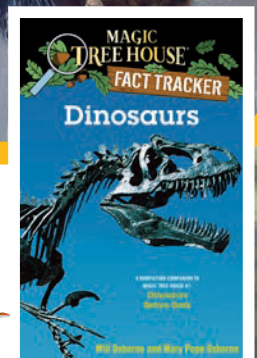


DO YOU KNOW THESE DINOSAUR FACTS?

POPSICLE STICK DINOSAUR CRAFT FUN!

Create your own "pet" dinosaur with this craft idea!

Ask an adult's permission before using scissors!



WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Popsicle sticks
- Green paint
- Glue
- Card stock or heavy paper
- Scissors
- Colored pens, pencils, markers, or crayons

STEP 1:

Paint three Popsicle sticks green and let them dry. Once they are dry, glue them into a triangle.

STEP 2:

Create a body for your dinosaur. Have an adult help you cut these shapes out of paper:

- A large triangle for the body
- A long oval for the tail
- A few small, triangular spikes for the back
- Two rectangles for the legs
- An L-shape for the head

STEP 3:

Glue the large triangle representing the body onto the back of the Popsicle sticks. Then glue the head, tail, legs, and spikes onto the dinosaur and let the glue dry.

STEP 3:

Once dry, use drawing utensils to draw a face and a design on your dinosaur. Now you've made a dinosaur for the (prehistoric) ages!

STEP 1:

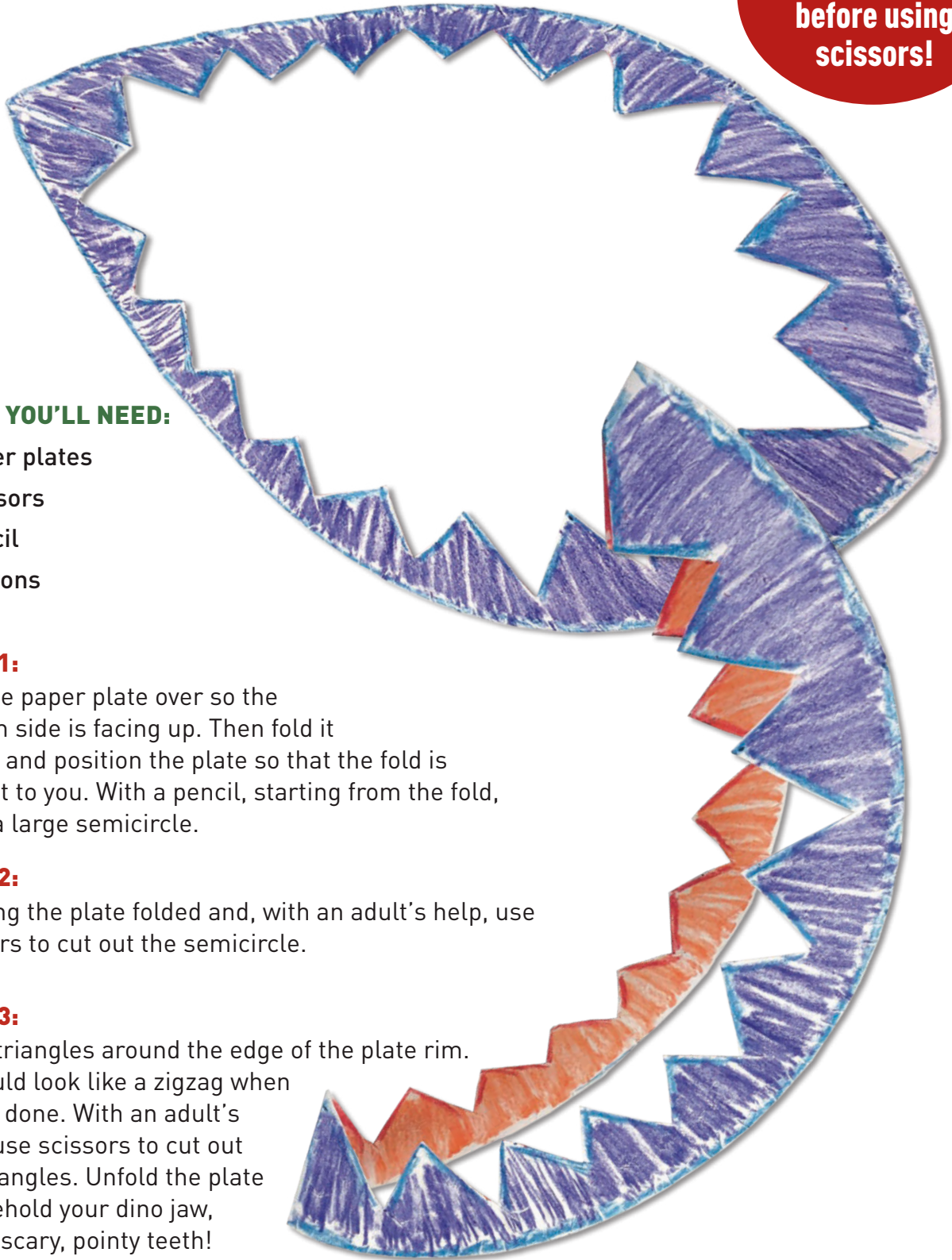
Flip the paper plate over so the bottom side is facing up. Then fold it in half and position the plate so that the fold is closest to you. With a pencil, starting from the fold, draw a large semicircle.

STEP 2:

Keeping the plate folded and, with an adult's help, use scissors to cut out the semicircle.

STEP 3:

Draw triangles around the edge of the plate rim. It should look like a zigzag when you're done. With an adult's help, use scissors to cut out the triangles. Unfold the plate and behold your dino jaw, full of scary, pointy teeth! For extra fun, color in the teeth!





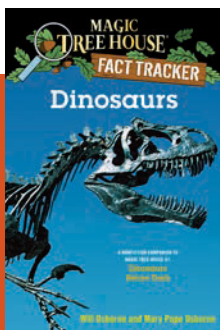

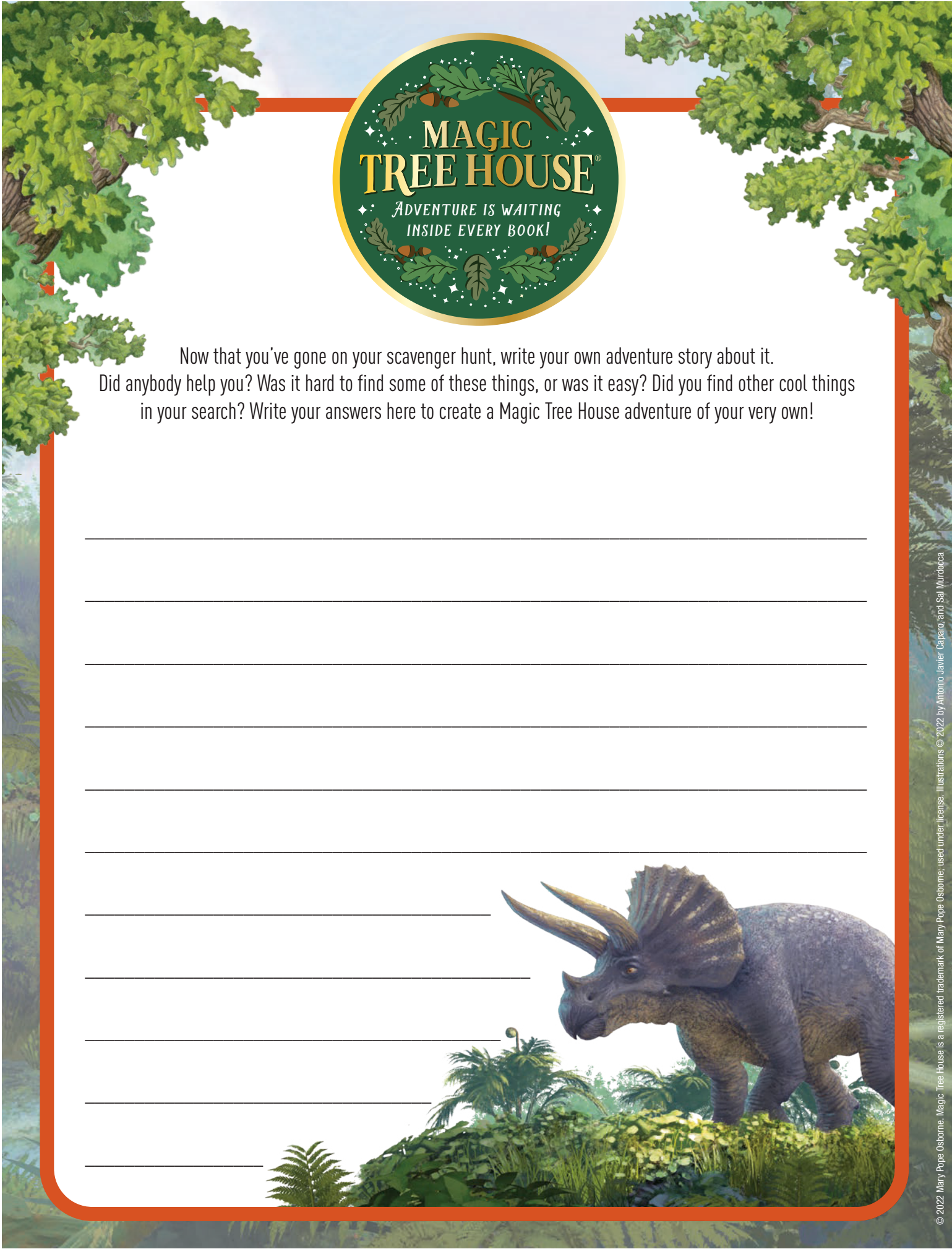

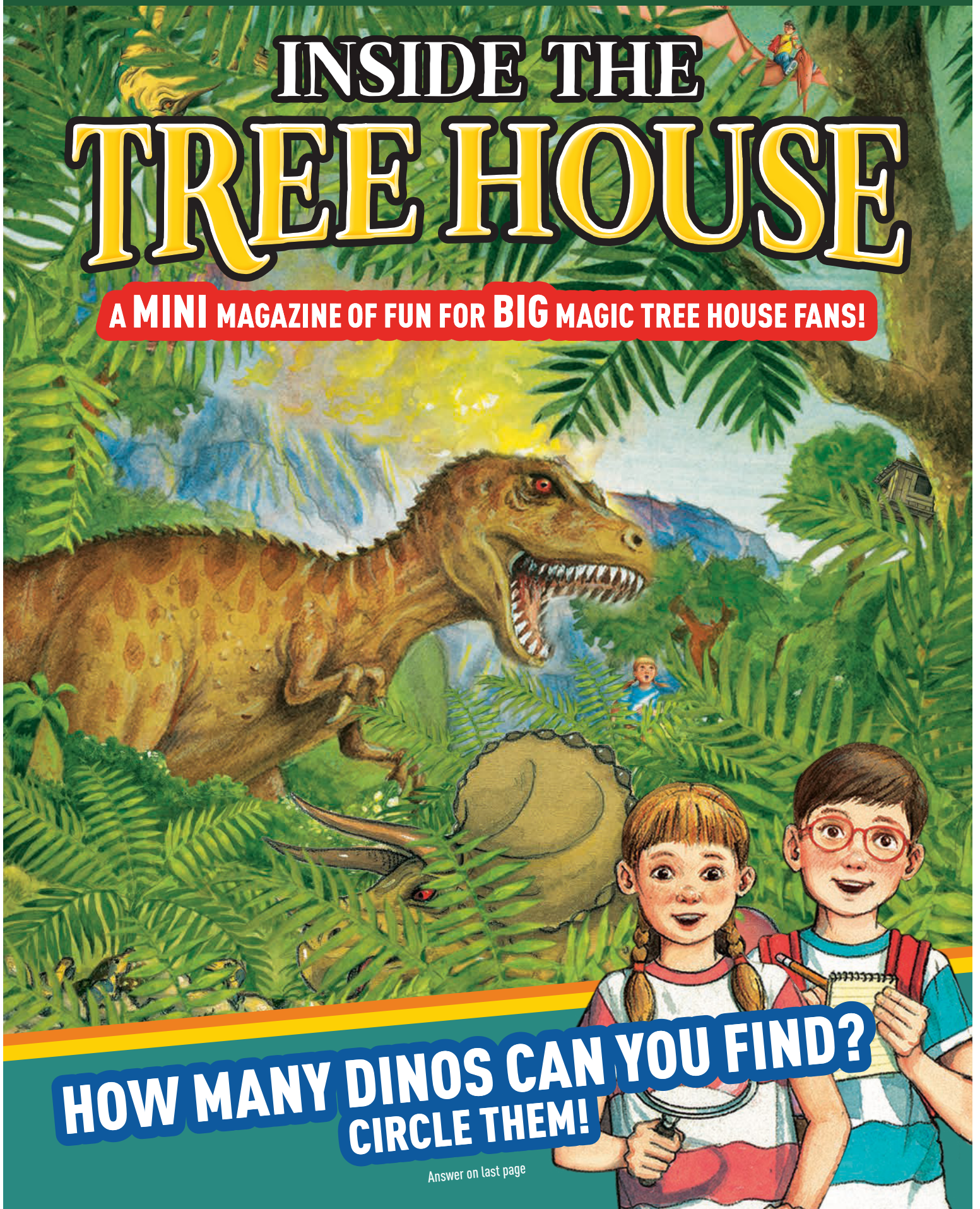

VIEWS FROM MARY'S TREE HOUSE

Q: When did you first start writing the Magic Tree House series, and how many books are there today?

A: I began the series 26 years ago, and today there are over 100 Magic Tree House books, counting all the fiction and the nonfiction Fact Trackers books.

Q: Do you have a favorite book, and if so, which one is it?

A: My World War II book meant the most to me: *World at War, 1944*. It's the longest and most advanced book in the series, and to me, the most exciting.

Q: How did you choose the topic for your new book, *Warriors in Winter*?

A: I've always wanted to write about an ancient Roman warrior camp. Roman warriors were considered some of the bravest, strongest, and best-trained warriors of all time.

Q: Which Fact Tracker did you find most interesting to research?

A: I think the most interesting research may have been for an upcoming book on Benjamin Franklin. I thought I knew a lot about him, but there was so much I didn't know—all the years he spent in Paris and London, the languages he taught himself, his inventions! I was in complete awe of this brilliant man.

Q: Have you ever traveled to do research for a Fact Tracker, and if so, where was the most exciting place you traveled?

A: I haven't traveled a lot just to do research, but having lived in many places has helped my writing. Writing *Leprechauns and Irish Folklore* was easier because I lived in Ireland. My firsthand knowledge of the Revolutionary War came from having lived near the Yorktown battleground. When I wrote about tsunamis I remembered that they tested the tsunami warning sirens when we lived on the beach in Hawaii.

Q: What is your favorite winter activity?

A: I love to hear our old house creak and groan in a snowstorm. A good fire in the fireplace, people you can laugh with on a cold winter night, a lovely stew, and reading a great book are my idea of heaven during long winters in the Berkshire Hills.

AROUND THE WORLD WITH JACK AND ANNIE!

THE ARCTIC

In *Polar Bears Past Bedtime*, Jack and Annie are whisked away to the frozen Arctic where they meet a seal hunter, Siberian huskies, and a giant polar bear! When they meet their new seal hunter friend, they learn that he "wears sealskin clothing to protect him from icy winds" (13). Seal hunters often live in igloos, which "means 'house' in the language of the native Arctic people. The house is built with . . . dry snow [which] is good wall material because it keeps in the heat. The temperature inside an igloo can be 65 degrees warmer than the temperature outside" (26).



Can you imagine living in an igloo? You would have to cook, sleep, and play all in one small room with the rest of your family. And forget having a TV! Kids in the Arctic would have fun by playing games like Kneel Jump, where they kneel on the floor, then jump forward on their knees. Try that with your friends! If you were in the Arctic, you would also be able to see the Northern Lights. "The swirl of light is caused by electrically charged particles from the sun striking atoms and molecules in the earth's atmosphere" (50). What colors do you see in this Northern Lights picture?

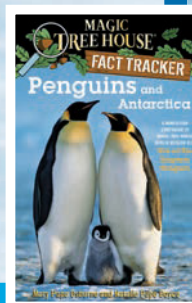

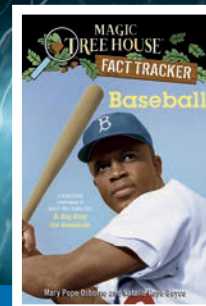
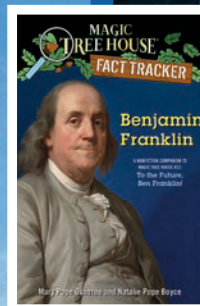


Because of all the work he did for the colonies and the United States, Ben is sometimes called the **FIRST AMERICAN**.

During a big thunderstorm, in 1752, Ben and his son William stood outside in the rain with a kite, a metal rod, and a metal key. An electrical charge from the storm clouds traveled down the rod and into the key, and thanks to this experiment, the world found out that lightning is a type of electricity.



On April 15, 1947, **JACKIE ROBINSON** became one of the first black players on a Major League team. Although fans, players, and even some of his own teammates threatened and physically abused him, Jackie never lost his temper. Jackie went on to win the first Rookie of the Year Award for being the best new MLB player.



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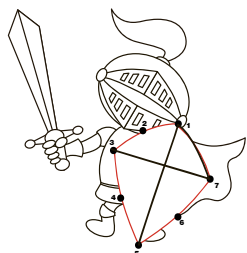
