We recently caught up with Mary Pope Osborne, author of Magic Tree House and Merlin Missions, and Natalie Pope Boyce, author of the Magic Tree House Fact Trackers, and asked them a few questions!

How long does it take to make a Magic Tree House book, from starting to write to when it actually hits shelves?

Mary: When I'm working on a book, I usually work many hours at a time. I could start work at 5 am or 5 pm—depends on what my day is like and how I'm feeling. I estimate it's about a year and a half between when I start work on a new book and when it hits the shelves.

What is the most exotic animal you've ever seen in person?

Natalie: Mary and I wrote books on pandas and spent time in the panda section of the National Zoo in Washington, D.C. There was a brand-new baby panda there that was so small . . . just 6 inches long . . . it was hard to believe it could later weigh over 200 pounds!

If you were to ever go on a safari, what would you most like to see or experience?

Mary: I'd love to see giraffes. They seem miraculous to me. But then so do lions and rhinos and elephants and gazelles. Goodness, I LOVE all animals. They all seem miraculous.

What inspired you to write about the llamas of Machu Picchu?

Natalie: Most people in the United States have seen llamas but don't know much about them. We learned that llamas first lived in North America and then over thousands of years wandered down into South America, especially to the Andes Mountains. Even today, it isn't unusual to see a boy or girl in the Andes mountains taking care of their family's llama herd.




FACT TRACKER

llamas spit at other llamas to tell them to BACK OFF! If a llama's ears are down and flat against its head, this means it is mad!






Llamas do less harm to the ground beneath them than a hiker wearing hiking boots because of their PADDED FEET, which help them to feel and maneuver across rocky terrain.











Who do you feel you are most similar to, Jack or Annie?

Mary: I'm a bit of both of them, but I'm not nearly as brave as Annie, and not nearly as smart as Jack.



A good sleeping bag, waterproof clothes, a tent, and a flashlight.





YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK FACTS?


PARK is home to the tallest waterfall in the United States and one of the tallest waterfalls in the world—Yosemite Falls.

Some of the GIANT SEQUOIAS in Yosemite could be more than 3,000 years old!

THE DOUGLAS SQUIRREL—a tiny, tiny animal—is called the spirit of the sequoia tree. The Douglas will eat and scatter seeds from pine cones, enabling sequoia seeds to sprout.



But don't think of rewriting as "hard work." Combining your language skills with your imagination can truly be an exciting adventure.

What new facts did you learn about Nepal when researching Sunlight on the Snow Leopard? Mary: I learned more about the wonder and mystery of the snow leopard.

What wintertime activities do you enjoy?

Mary: My favorite wintertime activity is to sit by a fire and read a good story. (Or sit by a fire and write a story!)

Jack and Annie have a mission in the mountains . . . to find a ghost! But what




does all this have to do with an old man and a snow leopard? The journey is dangerous and the path uncertain, but Jack and Annie can do this—they're the only ones who can!




