


Kalamata felt brave at the spice market she visited in India. Help her remember what it was like and find her courage again by putting the puzzle together.

___ After Tyrus graduates art school, he works for Walt Disney Studios, where he paints landscapes for the backgrounds of *Bambi*.



Butterfly Box Breathing






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Beautiful Butterfly



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
Color to the Beat of Your Own Drum




Connect the Notes




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
Make your own PAPER CRANE!

Momo and her friends must rely on some pretty absurd modes of transportation over the course of their adventures, including flying on the back of a paper crane! Learn how to make your own origami crane using the steps below!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED: I square piece of paper

- I. Grab a piece of square paper. Fold it in half diagonally by taking the top corner and folding it to the bottom corner. You should have a triangle.
- 2. Fold the triangle in half by taking the right corner and folding it to the left.
- 3. Pull up the top layer of the triangle, bringing the left corner of the triangle down to the bottom corner. Crease on the right and left sides.
- 4. You should now have a shape that looks like this.
- 5. Flip the paper over.
- 6. Do the same to the other side by lifting the top layer and bringing the right corner down to the bottom corner. Crease the sides so that it lays flat in a square shape.
- 7. Take both sides of the top layer and fold them in to meet at the middle and fold the top point down, creasing where the two flaps meet.
- 8. Unfold what you did in step 7.
- 9. Lift the top piece of paper upward and fold the left and right sides inward to create a long, thin diamond in the middle.
- 10. Flip the paper over.
- II. Repeat steps 7 and 8.
- 12. Repeat step 9. Now you should have a skinny kite shape.
- 13. Fold the lower right point up and to the right, flatten the new crease, and then unfold. Open the right side and fold that same point back up toward the center.
- 14. Repeat step 13 on the left side.
- 15. Bend down the tip of the left point you just folded up to form the beak of the crane.
- 16. Fold the two tall points down on either side to form the wings.
- 17. Enjoy your finished crane.







LABYRINTH

Lord of the sea and storms


