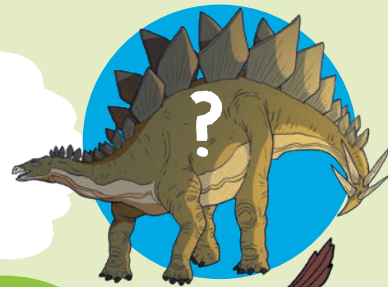

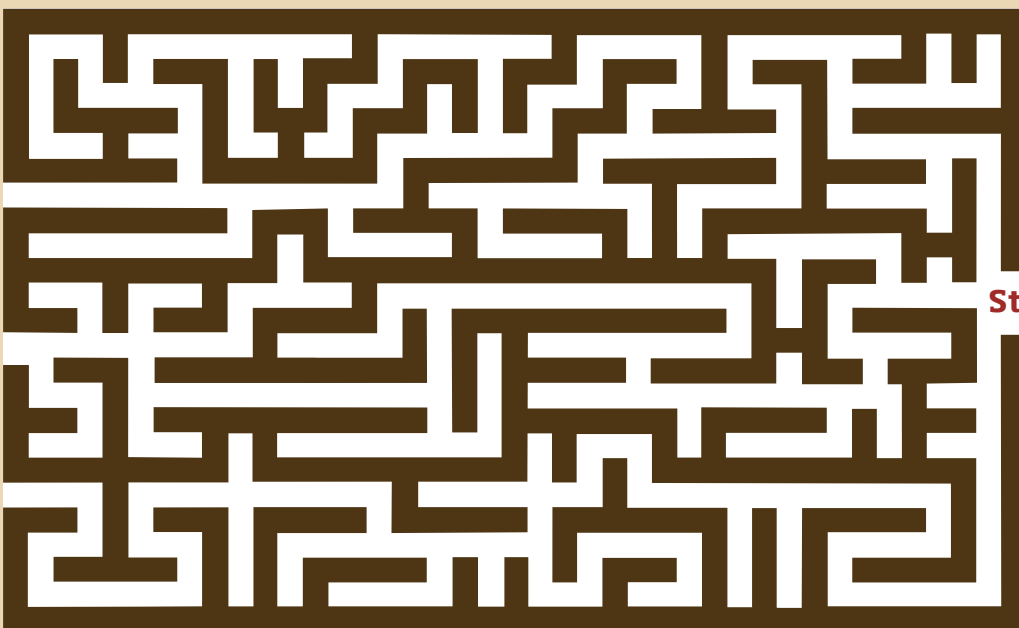

- Its name comes from Greek words meaning "three-horned face"

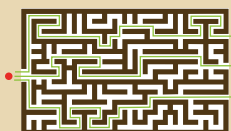
