

What Makes Your Heart Grow?


A gratitude activity inspired by the Grinch!



- 4. Hang them up in your home to remind yourself what really matters during the holidays!






Help Cindy-Lou Who Light the Christmas Tree!







Spot-the-Difference Fun!

Look closely! Can you spot 6 differences between these two images from Dr. Seuss's How the Grinch Lost Christmas!?














Aren't Baby Grinch, Baby Cindy-Lou *Who*, and Baby Max the cutest? Grab your crayons and bring them to life with color!
